We are approaching our election day for Trustees on June 25, 2025. We look forward to seeing all members (that are in good standing) participate in the election process.

The election will be held in Building C, for those who wish to vote in person using paper ballots. The vote count will be conducted in Building C auditorium by our CPA and Election Committee.

If you cannot vote in person and wish to vote, please contact the clubhouse office to sign for and obtain an absentee ballot and the instructions. Absentee ballots will only be given in person to the individual and not for someone else. To ensure that your absentee ballot is counted. It should be returned on or before June 19, 2025, before 2:00 P.M. Please see this month's Southwind for details regarding candidate(s) and election requirements.

Although there are only (3) three available seats, I will impress upon you that your vote is important! So, please vote for the candidate(s) who will be your Trustees for the next 3 years. Two people will have a (3) year term and one person will have (1) year term. The two highest votes get the three-year term.

We hope to see you on Election Day. Stay safe and healthy.

NOTICE/CALL FOR CANDIDATES - HOLIDAY CITY SOUTH HOMEOWNERS CORP.

Dear Homeowner,

On the advice of our Legal Counsel, Becker LLP, we will be following the provisions set forth in the Radburn Act which requires that we send out this "Call/Notice for Candidates" for the 3 seats that will become available on the Board of Trustees and be decided on our proposed Election Day, June 25, 2025.

Our Master Deed/Declaration (Covenants and Restrictions) and By-Laws indicate that we are currently approaching our annual election period. The candidate(s) meeting (s) which allow candidates to speak to the members, is held on the 2nd Thursday of May (8th) and June (12th). The Homeowner's Meeting scheduled for those days will begin at 6:00 PM in the clubhouse. These meetings will be abbreviated business meetings in order to give the membership the opportunity to hear from the candidate vying for the 3 available seats on the Board of Trustees. The Election Committee will gather the data necessary to begin the election process and will oversee it in accordance with the timeline posted in the Southwind. Voting will be permitted in person and by Absentee ballot.

For you to become a candidate, you must be in good standing (which means that any fees associated with your account must be paid in full prior to running for the Board of Trustees) and be a permanent resident for 9 months prior to the date of submission of nomination. The 2 candidates with the most votes will serve on the Board of Trustees for three (3) year terms and the lowest of votes will serve 1 year term.

While the By-laws explain the powers and duties of the Board of Trustees, I would like to briefly highlight some of the responsibilities your Board of Trustees have, so that you may further understand the Trustee position and its importance to you as a homeowner. The Board of Trustees has the responsibility for the operation, care, upkeep and maintenance of the

facilities, contract negotiation, insurance for the Association and maintenance of reserve funds. Additionally, information gathered from reserve studies compiled by the Association's Engineering Firm assists in preparation of the annual budget and is collated, then discussed with our Certified Public Accountant (CPA) to determine the Associations financial standing. The Board is also responsible for adjusting or increasing any annual assessments and also calling for special assessments, as the Board deems necessary. These matters are discussed with our CPA, Legal Counsel and voted on by the members of the Board. There are also the many additional responsibilities concerning the daily operation of our homeowner's association. Our Board of Trustees is made up of homeowners who manage the Association's facilities and are fiduciarily responsible with the membership's best interest in mind. The current Board are all members of the Senior Coalition in Berkeley Township, HOA Leader and CAI (Community Association Institute). These are organizations that provide information on current and upcoming legislation and education in the managing of an HOA. To provide the best service to our community continuing education and awareness is part of the responsibility. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for the Board of Trustees, please see the form on the reverse side, fill it out and return it to the Clubhouse with a clear photo no later than 2:00 PM on 4/24/25.

Memorandum: Board meeting with Legal Counsel regarding the 2025 Election

Date: April & May

Timeline:

5/2/2025 - A Notice of Delinquency will be mailed out to all delinquent (over 30 days) homeowners Homeowners who are not delinquent as of the 9th will not receive this notice.

5/9/2025 - Close of business (2PM). All supporting documents (i.e. death certificates, Powers of Attorney and deeds) must be presented to Office Staff. After this date, no records will be accepted and votes will be assigned as either one-half or a whole vote. This date will be the records date for the election.

6/10/2025 - Close of business. Last day to request an absentee ballot.


6/25/2025 - 11AM to 7PM voting will be open. There will be at least one individual (a gatekeeper) with the Association's computer system, to determine if a voter if eligible to vote and if so, whether a half or whole vote will be provided to the unit owners(s). At 7PM, the tallying will commence with CPA overseeing the vote as in the past. One observer will be permitted in the front row and all other homeowners present must remain quiet to permit tallying.

Election Timeline Pursuant to Radburn Regulations



Members who are not in "good standing" must be notified by the association a minimum of 30 days prior to the election, that they are not in good standing. Such notice shall state the reason why the resident is not in good standing. The notice shall state that residents have the right to contest the board's determination by requesting Alternative Dispute Resolution. Residents shall be allowed to rectify their standing up until 5 business days prior to the election date. The ADR notice should state that they have 10 days to request ADR or it is waived.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:26-8.8(c), an Owner is deemed to be in "good standing" if they, "(1) are current in the payment of common expenses, late fees, interest on unpaid assessments, legal fees, or other charges lawfully assessed; (2) are in compliance with a judgment for common expenses, late fees, interest on unpaid assessments, legal fees, or other charges lawfully assessed; (3) are in full compliance with a settlement agreement with respect to the payments of assessments, legal fees, or other charges lawfully assessed; (4) have requested or are participating in Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) or in a court proceeding for a dispute over a matter that affects the owner's good standing."

CODE COMMITTEE ATTENTION ALL RESIDENTS OF HOLIDAY CITY SOUTH

Please be advised that as of February 17th 2025, the Board of Trustees has decided to reconstruct the entire Code Committee and its process to hopefully improve all areas of its operations.

If you have interest in serving on the Code Committee, please apply in letter or email directly to the Trustees ASAP.

We look forward to hearing from the many residents that have the knowledge and ability to serve our association in this very important capacity.

Resolution for limit on the number of homes owned by one Homeowner and/or LLC

(This resolution also limits the number of homes that can be rented in the community)

Homeowners, LLCs, Corporations, Trusts, partnerships or any other legal entity (referred to as entity) must own a home for (3) three years prior to renting said property. The number of properties (homes) permitted to be rented in the community should not exceed 200 homes or 8.5% of the 2359 homes in the community.

Homeowners, LLCs, Corporations, Trusts, partnerships or any other legal entity shall not be permitted to purchase more than (3) three properties. Should the number of homes exceed the ownership limit permitted in this resolution at the time of approval, those homeowner(s) (entity) shall be grandfathered. That status shall remain directly related to the homes owned at the time of passage of this resolution until such time as the homes are sold (or ownership changes). Upon reduction in the number of homes owned by the grandfathered entity, that number will remain at the reduced number of properties. This will continue should the entity continue as an owner of properties and will be reduced as properties are sold off or transferred.

The intent of this resolution is to ensure the integrity of the community as a retirement community providing for affordable home ownership for individuals under the Housing for Older Protection Act (HOPA) which allows communities to market themselves as 55+ or age restricted under the following age requirements:

- The community publishes and adheres to policies and procedures that demonstrate the intent to provide housing for older persons.
- The community complies with the federal rules for verification of the occupancy every two years.
- The communities have governing documents in place that are adhered to demonstrating their intent to comply with the Housing for Older Protection Act.

Limiting the number of homes that are available as rental properties will afford closer controls and adherence to the regulations under the Housing for Older Protection Act.

Many questions are being asked about the new trash collection procedure and the types of cans that will be available. Please go unto the Berkeley Township web site and read through all the Question being asked by our residents.

Automated Trash and Recycling Information

Holiday City Residents will receive one (1) free 65-gallon trash, and one (1) free 65-gallon recycling can. If you wish to receive a 95-gallon can for either trash or recycling or both please call 732-349-4616. If you are okay with receiving the 65-gallon cans, you do not need to do anything.

We plan to be fully automated by the end of the second quarter of this year. We are asking all residents to start using your new can once you receive it. Once you receive your new can, please put your old can(s) out to the curb for the township to pick up.

These cans are for trash and recycling only. There will not be a change in the way leaves are picked up. Bulk pickup will continue but will need to be scheduled for a pickup by calling the Township DPW at 732-349-4616.

Absolutely NO exterior additions, changes, or alterations of any kind can be made until the plans and specifications showing all details are submitted to the Code Committee and approved by the Board.

If plans are within the guidelines of our By-Laws, an approval letter will be prepared and given to the homeowner and submitted to the Zoning Board Officer of Berkeley Township to obtain a permit.

This pertains to any changes, additions, or alterations on the exterior of the home - roof, siding, paint, driveway, patio, sheds, etc.

Absolutely **NO WORK** can be started without permission from the Homeowners' Association or without a permit. FINES WILL BE IMPOSED if this is not adhered to.

GARBAGE NOTICE

Garbage is **NOT** to be put out to the curb **before 4:00 PM on Mondays**. This is a Berkeley Township Ordinance and HCS residents must comply. Violators may be issued a fine for non-conformance by the Township and/or HCS. Trash receptacles must be kept in your garage, behind your home, or in an area out of view from the street. Receptacles must be covered and concealed. If you are away, consider having a friend or neighbor place your garbage cans at the curb and return them to their respective out-of-view locations after trash pickup.

With the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus, Berkeley Sanitation Department's rules for putting out trash is as follows: The Township has made key changes to trash pickup. All household trash must be bagged and placed in an outdoor trash receptacle. Sanitation employees will not pick up trash that is not bagged.

A special thanks to all our Veterans and 1st responders today in the Hudson River.

Spokesman Jim Kenny (Think Energy Solar Farm): Showed a presentation on community solar. It is a state-wide project and currently for Berkley Township residents that can save them 20% of their JCP&L bill. There's 30 acres of land located across from Berkley Municipal building with panels on that land. You can sign up (at no cost) at: JCP&L's website, search Community Solar or call 844-870-6437 for more information. Spaces are limited.

Roll Call Taken: All Trustees in attendance.

Business: Current Treasurer's financial report: The operating balance is \$394,085.44 and total operating is \$442,177.22. Our total reserve fund is \$1,005,350.12.

Pickleball / Tennis Courts: Construction has begun. The paving and topcoat will resume when weather permits. Possibly completed mid-May.

Shuffleboard Courts: A meeting is scheduled for April 16th and the courts will be groomed next week. Playing begins on April 29th.

Pool Hours: May 24th (the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend) and the whole month of June pool hours will be 9AM to 8PM. July and August will be 9AM to 10PM. September will be 9AM to 8PM (until September 21st-weather permitting).

Suggestion Box: Several suggestions were addressed – yoga and the ceramic kiln. At some point the Trustees will have a discussion on possible yoga classes and are awaiting an answer from Holiday City Berkley on the offer of selling of the kiln in bldg. B.

Monthly Southwind Calendar: A Trustee acknowledges the great work Missy Connelly (office staff) does by putting all the information and graphics into the calendar each month.

Code Committee: The new code committee members are: Sylvia Armando, James Armando, William Hollenbach, John Tealia and Steve Pontak. The Board still needs more people as backup and substitutes.

Canopy: Will be fixed next week as the parts have been ordered. There is no charge to us, it's being paid for by the insurance company of their landscaper.

Robo Cans: They have been delayed until May. You can still order the 95-gallon cans by calling DPW and giving a name and address.

Woman's Club: Is having a program next week - Beyond the Sea: The Life and Music of Bobby Darin. Boby Darin's brother and best friend will attend and put on the presentation.

Men's Club: The plastic recycler can only offer benches to HCS. Car show, food and music May 10th at clubhouse (rain date May 11th). Signs will be posted at the corner of Mule and Santiago roads. \$20 (cash/check) to enter your car. Visitors are free. June 21st for the Hawaiian luau in the tent.

Social Club: Male beauty pageant in bathing suits on June 4th. Their attire will be modeled after the 1940s, gay 90s or 1890s with the red and white stripes, a mustache and a straw hat.

Robo Calls: A resident questions why no one was notified the changing of our HOA President. They had heard a rumor about Vince's exit but did not fully learn of it until they read it in the Southwind. They also questioned the lack of transparency in announcing the new President at the meeting. A Trustee let the resident know it was Vince's wish to keep it quiet and in all the confusion of placing a new President on the Board, his official announcement was forgotten.

Badge System: A resident questioned why openings for new resident's badge appointments can possibly take a few months. A Trustee explained that all new residents receive a welcome packet with the instructions needed within the packet to schedule their appointment. The enormous number of pictures and details that need to go into the system along with normal office duties each month takes quite a bit of time.

Absentee Ballots: A resident questioned why someone would have to come to the office to obtain an absentee ballot if they are disabled, elderly or cannot leave their home. A Trustee let it be known that in certain instances, the ballot will be delivered to those people.

Trustee Absence: A resident (and former Trustee) questioned why a Trustee should be able to miss the weekly Tuesday meetings and the 1X a month meeting with all the associations and should

abide being at all meetings. The resident said that being physically absent bothers a lot of people and they don't see how the work can be done on the phone. A Trustee informed the resident that they participated in every Board discussion they were allowed to participate in while working on several contracts, voted where needed and communicated with the Board.

HOA Transparency: A resident questioned the lack of HOA transparency regarding the voting for certain individuals and not being informed of exclusions. This resident and family also had experiences with someone not being very nice to some residents. This resident did not want to name names, but did say it was either someone that works on the payroll, volunteers or is on the Board.

Black Mulch: A resident questioned the black mulch outside of Bldgs A & C since in March's HOA meeting it was announced that the black mulch was a fire hazard. A Trustee said the black mulch bill was changed and we are allowed to use it until further notice. The Trustee also said the mulch was previously ordered and delivered before the 1st notice went out.

Past President's Statement: A resident was unhappy with a portion of the (previous) President's statement in regards to implying they did the work themself instead of the absent Trustee. The resident stated they knew the (absent) Trustee accomplished the needed work.

The meeting was officially closed.

USE OF PICKLE BALL COURTS

Pickleball courts will be open (approx. mid-May), 7 days a week for HCS residents. HCS residents can bring guests (2 per household). However, if the courts are full, residents take priority to play over residents with guests. Residents with guests will need to complete their game and then allow the residents to play.

The 4 pickleball courts have the capacity for people to play and sharing is encouraged but the underlying principle will be that residents have priority.

All residents must have their ID badges on them, as well as guest passes (the same guest passes used for the pool.)

No Trustee will be there to monitor the games - it will be on the honor system. The goal is to have HCS homeowners to get the most use out of these newly renovated courts. However, if we find people violating these rules, their use of these amenities can be restricted.

It is highly recommended to get the TeamReach app.

The **TeamReach** app. will be used to manage and schedule specific play sessions for group play. These sessions will follow the rules set forth for residents and their quests. TeamReach sessions provide users with information on who is playing, how many players have signed up per session, as well as availability of the courts. Sessions will also identify skill levels and will give users the opportunity to decide what and when they want to play.

To join TeamReach-message Bill Molloy at 848-240-4822 to be approved to join the app. He will assist individuals on the use of the app along with answering all TeamReach questions.

Accommodations will be made for anyone wishing to play tennis by limiting play on 2 of the 4 pickleball courts.







TREES IN THE COMMUNITY

Recently we have had several severe storms. Many of us have had tree limbs and or trees fall. The rule of thumb regarding these fallen trees and/or tree limbs is simple. If a tree or tree limb(s) that are in the common area fall in the common area, we leave the downed tree and/or tree limbs where they fall, unless they are creating a hazard. If a tree or tree limbs from the common area fall onto a member's property, the association will remove them. If a tree and /or tree limb do damage to a homeowner's home, they will have to file through their homeowner's insurance for damages, but the association will have the tree and/or tree limbs removed. Also, if the downed tree and/or tree limbs from a tree are from one that stood on the homeowner's property or the township right of way, the homeowner has responsibility for any damage they may cause. This should clarify the association policy for downed trees and/or tree limbs. If a homeowner has a tree on their property and would like to have it removed and are not sure if that tree is on their property for sure, please call the Code Committee and have them come check on it before removing anything. Berkeley Township requires that you have a permit to remove trees.

Berkeley Township's Animal Control Department PROHIBITS feeding wildlife.



PLEASE ADHERE TO THIS ORDINANCE!

DO NOT FEED WILDLIFE

§ 9-18.1 Feeding Wildlife Prohibited.

No person or persons shall give, place, expose, deposit, distribute to scatter any edible material with the intention of feeding, attracting, or enticing wild animals, specifically including, but not limited to, deer, coyotes, waterfowl, rodents of any kind, or any stray domestic animals in the Township of Berkeley on property either publicly or privately owned. This shall not include the use of birdseed to feed birds.

I know many residents here in our community will be making plans to work on projects to beautify their properties or just to make repairs.

If you have plans to do any repairs or renovations, please remember to do your due diligence when hiring a contractor. The Berkeley Township Web site has many helpful points of information so that you protect yourself, the consumer. A few of the points given are:

TIPS FOR CONSUMERS

The Contractor must have a NJ Consumer Affairs Registration/License number and it should resemble this style number (#13VH12345600)

- **Contact Consumer Affairs to see if this NJ registration/license is good and if consumers have filed any complaints against the contractor and to ensure the contractor is registered.
- ** Get written estimates from at least three contractors.
- **Ask the contractors how long they have been in business, if they have liability insurance (as required by law), and whether they will be using subcontractors on the project.
- ** Contact the references your contractor gives you. Ask the referenced person whether the job was completed on time, whether there were any unexpected costs, whether the workers showed up on time and cleaned up when they finished, and whether they would use the contractor again.
- ** Ask your contractor about his or her professional affiliations and confirm the information with those organizations.
- ** Do not pay for the entire job up front. The customary arrangement is one-third in advance, one-third halfway through the job and one-third upon completion. Do not pay with cash.

KNOW THE LAW

Obtain a written contract. Contracts for home improvement projects costing \$500 or more must be written and must include the legal name and business address of the contractor as well as a start date, a completion date, a description of the work to be done, and the total price.
